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## Bernard Gheur

Bernard Gheur was born during the bombing of Liège on 18 February 1945. When he was at secondary school, at the Collège Saint-Servais, he made several short films. After studying Law at the University of Liège, he obtained, in 1968, a degree in journalism from the Université libre in Brussels. His first novel, 'Testament d'un cancre' published by Albin Michel in 1970, contained a glowing preface by François Truffaut.
